You were a volunteer first before becoming the Community Relations Manager with TIP Orange County. Why did you choose to volunteer with TIP?

Although I had never volunteered in the past, there was a desire to do so and be a part of the community. I knew I wanted to be a part of an organization that I could relate to in some way based on my own life experiences. TIP completely filled that. In 2001, My Mother was killed by a drunk driver, so I understood the trauma of a sudden death and the lonely, helpless feeling that follows.

What are some of your favorite things about the TIP program?

I believe that people are meant to be there for one another in good and bad times. TIP provides a way to do that, helping citizens be there for one another during a traumatic situation. I also love the fact that there are so many citizens that are willing to volunteer their time to become a TIP volunteer and help those in need.

What do your family/friends say about your involvement with TIP?

My family is extremely supportive and encouraging about my involvement with TIP. My husband loves the program as well and never complains when I run out of the house on a call

While we were waiting for the next "disaster" to strike the group suggested we volunteer for TIP, the Red Cross, etc. I was intriqued by TIP and the work that was happening. I called Wayne...he was not sold on the dog but invited me to join. I was in the program for about 2 weeks and a tragic suicide occurred. It was a perfect opportunity for "Jamison" to show the group what he was capable of. . .the rest is history. "Jamison" volunteered in TIP **Orange County for** almost 4 years before he was retired and I am still with the group. Now he waits for me when I return from calls with a wag of the tail and a good lick and is up with me every time I dispatch a call.

Besides all of the wonderful volunteers. leadership and We are trusted by first responders. My favorite thing about TIP is the fact that we are there to simply be by the side of a family. In the first few hours of a tragedy we offer support and after a call, on the day of or days following we connect with the victims providing valuable resources to help guide and answer questions that may arise.

What do your family/friends say about your involvement with TIP?

My family respects and honors my involvement. They often say how they admire my passion and dedication to TIP. I have full support from those close to me and I appreciate that very much.

What about your new job as Community Relations Manager excites you the most?

What about your new job as co-Crisis Team Manager excites you the most?

Besides being excited to have an opportunity to do what I can to make it and keep it a successful program. I am excited for the opportunity to meet with first responders and discuss how TIP is working for them and how we can continue to build the program and help more citizens that are experiencing a trauma.

I try to do a little of everything. Love my kids (2 and 4) and take them for outings as much as possible, we I am most excited about the NODA (No One Dies Alone) Program. I believe this is valuable to every community and I look forward to developing this program. Not to mention making new friendships in OC!

I absolutely love long walks along the beach, photography, spending time with friends and family and spontaneous road trips!
